
Finally, I would like to thank everyone who has been involved with AMMA over the years – no matter the role you have played, you have contributed to the continued success of this valuable Association.





ADF findings on mental illness

According to the ADF Mental Health Prevalence and Wellbeing Study (2010) the prevalence of mental health conditions in the ADF is similar to the community, although the profile of specific mental health conditions in the ADF varies.

THE HONOURABLE LINDA DESSAU AM GOVERNOR OF VICTORIA

On 1 July 2015, the Honourable Linda Dessau AM was sworn in as Victoria's 29th Governor, the first female in the role.

Governor Dessau was born in Melbourne in 1953, and was educated at St Catherine's Girls' School, matriculating in 1969, before attending the University of Melbourne, where she gained the degree of LLB (Hons).

In 1975, she was admitted as a barrister and solicitor of the Supreme Court of Victoria. She signed the Bar Roll in 1978 and worked as a Crown counsel in Hong Kong between 1982 and 1985.

The Governor took her first judicial appointment in 1986 as a Magistrate. She sat in the Children's Court, Coroners Court and Melbourne Magistrates' Court.

In June 1995, the Governor was appointed a Judge of the Family Court of Australia, where she served for 18 years until July 2013.

Immediately before her appointment as Governor, she was President of the Melbourne Festival, Chair of the Winston Churchill Memorial Trust Victorian Regional Committee and a national Board member of the Trust, a Commissioner of the Australian Football League, a Trustee of the National Gallery of Victoria, a Board member and former Chair of AFL Sportsready and Artsready, a Board member of the Unicorn Foundation, and a Patron of Sports Connect.

In 2010, the Governor was made a Member of the Order of Australia for services to family law and the community.

The Governor and her husband Mr Anthony Howard, have two sons, both of whom completed Bachelors of Laws and Arts at Monash University.

RADM JENNY FIRMAN

RADM Jenny Firman completed her medical degree from University of Melbourne in 1981. While a student she joined the Royal Australian Navy and over the next 22 years was posted to a range of positions that included sea time and involvement in underwater medicine and, in the tri-Service environment, developing strategic and operational health policy.

She left full time Service in 2002 and transitioned to the Reserve and was appointed as the first Chief Medical Officer for the newly created Defence Force Recruiting organisation.

In 2008 she was appointed as Director General - Navy Health Reserve and performed that role until 2012. In February 2015 she was promoted to Rear Admiral and appointed as Surgeon General Australia Defence Force Reserve.



In her civilian working life she is the Principal Medical Adviser in the Office of Health Protection in the Department of Health. In this position she is responsible for the provision of medical and scientific advice to assist in the work of the Department and the Australian Government in communicable disease control and health emergencies. This has included the national response to pandemic H1N1 2009 influenza, the Japanese tsunami and radiation leak, Ebola, the current Zika outbreak, global problem of antimicrobial resistance as well as advice on the national immunisation program.

CAPT RUSS SCHEDLICH MB BS, MPH, FRACMA

Captain Russ Schedlich RANR graduated MB BS from the University of New South Wales in 1979 and, following his internship at Gosford Hospital, started his naval medical career at the Naval Air Station, HMAS Albatross, in 1980.

Subsequent postings to sea, HMAS Cerberus, HMAS Leeuwin and HMAS Stirling, the latter two giving him extensive practice in underwater medicine, saw him head to the United Kingdom for exchange service with the Royal Navy at the Undersea Medicine Division of the Institute of Naval Medicine at Portsmouth.

Returning to Australia in 1988, Russ spent a short time at the School of Underwater Medicine at HMAS Penguin before being

promoted Commander and being posted as Fleet Medical Officer at the beginning of 1989.

In 1991, Russ studied for a Master of Public Health at the University of Sydney and then, in 1992, was posted as Medical Officer-in-Charge, Balmoral Naval Hospital.

In 1993, Russ was put into project work to develop the concept of an advanced afloat surgical facility (a Primary Casualty Reception Facility). In 1994, Russ travelled to the United States to join the commissioning crew of HMAS Kanimbla, one of two former US Navy ships into which the PCRF was installed.

Russ was promoted to Captain in 1996 and posted (for the second time) as Fleet Medical Officer, also becoming Head Naval Health Branch. He left the Permanent Naval Forces from that post at the end of 1999.

Upon leaving the PNF, Russ spent a year on contract as Senior Medical Officer Fleet Base East before becoming Director Medical Services, Far West Area Health Service, at the end of 2000. He was seconded to the NSW Health Department in 2004 before heading north to Queensland as Executive Director Medical Services Central Queensland Health Service District in 2006.

In 2009, Russ was seconded to the Queensland State Health Emergency Coordination Centre to support the statewide response to the H1N1 influenza pandemic, and one year later joined Logan Hospital in southeast Queensland as Senior Medical Manager.

In 2012, Russ returned to NSW, taking up the position of Director Medical Services, Wagga Wagga Base Hospital, and then a year later to his current position of Director Medical Services, Liverpool 20 Hospital.

BEN WEBB

Ben Webb is the Centre Manager at the Veterans Centre -Sydney Northern Beaches with the objective of providing a holistic service to veteran families on Sydney's Northern Beaches. This Centre will be a focal point for the Veteran community offering support, assistance and a voice to raise awareness of the challenges they face.

Ben enlisted into the Royal Australian Artillery in February 2001 after completing year 12 studies at school. After Recruit and Corp specific training, Ben was posted to 8/12 MDM REGT in Darwin. During this period Ben participated in border protection and was promoted to Lance Bombardier in April 2003.



Later that year, Ben successfully applied for a transfer to Royal Australian Electrical Mechanical Engineers as an Electrical

Technician. In November 2007, Ben was posted to 10 FSB (Townsville) and deployed to Afghanistan in 2009/2010, for which he was awarded a Commendation. He was then promoted to Corporal December 2010.

Ben sustained many injuries throughout service career and these became prevalent in 2011. Numerous physical injuries and chronic pain syndrome became unmanageable and subsequently Ben developed severe depression.

Ben was medically discharged from service in October 2013. Throughout 2014 Ben focused on his rehabilitation and, during this time, began voluntary work with Soldier On as their health and fitness coordinator in South Australia. Ben found this role incredibly rewarding, not only due to those he was assisting, but the role became an integral part of his personal recovery.

Ben was selected to attend the 2014 Invictus Games representing Australia. The experience was another key milestone in Ben's recovery. One of the key reasons for Ben's relocation to the Northern Beaches was the sense of community. Ben now lives in Cromer with his partner Yan, and is proud to call the Northern Beaches home.


